Flavors of hazelnut, butter, peach, with a touch of vanilla. Great depth and body with a rich texture.

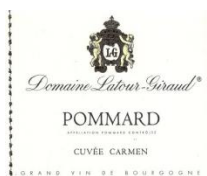

Exquisite structure with a roundness that is deep, smooth and shows an elegant fineness.

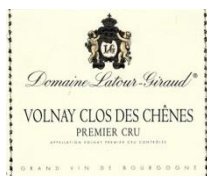
